History

Musicantes arises from the concern of its members, seeking to deepen the study and interpretation of Medieval music. To this end, it has carried out intense dissemination work by holding workshops, seminars and concerts throughout the entire Spanish geography, as well as Portugal, Italy, Ireland, France, Belgium, Israel, Sweden and Bulgaria.

The instruments used (citola, medieval lute, guiterna, Arab lute, rebec, psaltery, chicotén, viola de rueda or hurdy-gurdy, percussion, flutes, bagpipes, shawm, viola and fidula), are reproductions of instruments of the time, inspired by the existing iconography in our country.

Its repertoire ranges from the 13th to the 15th century (monodic music from the Middle Ages, polyphony from Ars Nova and the beginning of the Renaissance).

JAIME MUÑOZ (Flutes, Hornpipes, Medieval Bagpipes)

Multi-instrumentalist musician specialized in ethnic and medieval sounds. Higher degree in Baroque transverse flute from the Royal Conservatory of Music of Madrid.

Learn to play traditional flutes and diatonic accordion in a self-taught way, later attending various specialized courses and workshops: wooden transverse flute seminar given by Jean-Michael Veillon in Brittany; Basque accordion course taught by Kepa Junkera in La Coruña; diatonic accordion seminar in Lyon, France; Kaval (Bulgarian flute) seminar in Pamporovo, Bulgaria;



Bulgarian and oriental style clarinet classes in Madrid with Ivo Hristov, seminars at the Escuela de Música Creativa and the Taller de músicos de Madrid.

He is a founding member of the contemporary traditional music group "La Musgaña", with whom he has recorded twelve albums and toured and concerted over the last 30 years in: the United States, Canada, Morocco, Algeria, Germany, Italy, France, Slovenia, Ireland, Hungary, England, Serbia, Sweden, India, Finland, Tunisia, Mexico, Greece and a large part of the Spanish geography.

At the same time, he collaborates, in recordings and concerts, with musicians such as Luis Delgado, Eduardo Paniagua, Eduardo Laguillo, Ana Alcaide.

Likewise, he regularly participates in the film soundtracks of the composer Roque Baños, winner of several Goya awards. Other soloists or groups with whom he has worked are: Javier Bergia, Joaquín Díaz, Kepa Junkera, María Salgado, Bleizi Ruz, Chenoa, Carlos Núñez, Cormac Breatnach, Luis Paniagua, Javier Paxariño, Manuel Luna, Eliseo Parra, Ensemble Musicantes, etc.

ADRIANA ARIAS (Vielle)

She was born in A Coruña in 1993. He began studying violin in 1998 with Lucica Trita, concertmaster of the public RTV of Romania and principal of violins in the Galician Symphony Orchestra.

In 2007 he passed the 7th grade of Trinity College, and in that same year he became part of the Youth Orchestra of the Galician Symphony until 2012, where he will play in positions as principal of second violins and concertmaster. From 2003 to 2007 he was part of the group "Crescendo", offering concerts auditoriums, events and Galician television and in 2012 he collaborated with the Galician Women's Symphony Orchestra. In 2012 he moved to Madrid and played with orchestras such as the



Madrid Youth Orchestra, Complutense University Orchestra, Spain National Youth Orchestra, "Mad4Strings" soundtrack recording orchestra and since 2016 he is a member of the Baroque orchestra, the group medieval -in which he plays the fidula- and the string quartet of "Ars Combinatoria". In addition, he is a member of the medieval group "Musicantes" playing the fidula since 2019.

During his years of study, he took master classes with Professor Carmen Runceanu at the Enescu Conservatory in Bucharest (2003), with Maciej Rakowski at the Royal College of Music in London (2011), with Laurentiu Grigorescu in 2012 and 2018, with Sergey Fatkulin at 2016-17 and with Carole Petidemange in 2018.

In 2013, she obtained the Yamaha award for the most outstanding violinist, in the "Matisse" music course in San Lorenzo del Escorial.

He studied at the Royal Conservatory of Music in Madrid, between 2012-2016, initially with Professor Juan Llinares and later with Professor Ana Comesaña Kotliarskaya.


Since 2013, he has been teaching violin to children, youth and adults, working in various schools, academies and colleges, also teaching musical language and music and movement.

She has completed the Master's Degree in Music Teacher Training at the Complutense University of Madrid and is currently a secondary school music teacher at the Colegio Nuestra Señora de la Providencia in Madrid.

JAIME DEL AMO (Citole, Guiterne, Zanfona, Psalterium, Medieval Lute and conducting)

He has studied in the Real Conservatory from Madrid, in Campo de Criptana Conservatory (Ciudad Real City) and Arganda del Rey Conservatory, where he was graduated as plectrum instruments teacher with highest qualification.

Take part in the Master Classes of Lute and Mandolin organized by the International Festival of Plectrum Logroño under the direction of Pedro Chamorro and Ugo Orlandi.



He began his plectrum studies with José Ramón García, continuing them with Caridad Simón and Jose Maria Villafranca.

He take part in master classes of lute and mandolin organized in Logroño conducted by Pedro Chamorro and Ugo Orlandi. Take a part of several courses of Medieval Plectrum Instruments (citole, spanish medieval lute and medieval guitar), conducted by Jose Luis Pastor and organized by the Old Music Festival from Gijón, Old Music Festival from Aracena and the vihuela and the lute Societies.

Has been member of the group of Spanish lutes "Gaspar Sanz" and of "Tablatura Orchestra", with the one which has colaborates during 10 years, playing in the most importants national plectrum festivals and in Baden-Baden (Germany) and Santarem (Portugal).

Courrently is member of the Altisidora Group from Campo de Criptana (Ciudad Real) and Trío Assai with which he has recorded three recordings and has performed numerous concerts throughout the

Spanish territory, and U.S., Cuba , Venezuela, Italy, Portugal, France, Belgium, Bulgaria, Israel, Libya, Finland and Russia.

He has collaborated several times as soloist with the Chamartín Symphony Orchestra at the Spanish National Auditorium and with the Orchestra of the Teatro Real in Madrid.

WAFIR SHAIKHELDIN (Oud and Percussion)



Born in Kurdufan, he studied the Conservatory Khartoum and its first steps professional musician was playing the accordion in groups Almubarak Abdul Aziz, Mohammad Al Amin and Abdul Karm Al Kably. Also he Arabian play the lute, Sudanese bongos, the saz, viola, rabab and a variety of percussion instruments like

tambourines, drums, metal castanets (karakeb, etc.).

Since his arrival in Spain, for more than a decade, he has faced to the most diverse music in the most unexplored. The old music ensemble of Eduardo Paniagua, Hevia, the Musgaña, Joaquin Ruiz (flamenco), the Senegalese Djanbutu Thiossane, "Radio Tarifa" or "Amistades Peligrosas". Not forgetting, of course, collaborations with Rasha, her sister, and with The Black Band, with whom he shared, from beginning to end, his whole career, and which proved many of the issues that sail today for "The Blue Nile" (his latest album).

"Blue Nile" fully portrays the rich personality of Wafir S. Gibril. Mariem Hassan, Nayim Alal, Iain Ballamy, Josete Ordoñez, Pedro Esparza, Vincent Molino, Ivo and Nasco Hristov, Sebastián Rubio, Salah Sabbagh, among many others, have contributed their bit in this job.

DIANA REAL (Dance, Harp and Voice)



She Is formed as a dancer of oriental dances with the conductor of dance Cristiane Azem and in corporal expression "Method Schinca" with Marta Schinca. She has been a member of the company "Fenicia" conducted by Cristiane Azem acting as a solo dancer in theaters throughout the national area. She continues to collaborate as a guest artist.

She studied technique and vocal performance with the North American soprano Barbara Bonney (Salzburg) and Gloria Ruiz Ramos (Madrid). He specializes in medieval

music studying singing with tenor Cesar Carazo and collaborating regularly with the directors of ancient music Miguel Ángel Járaba and Eduardo Paniagua as a dancer, singer and harpist. With Paniagua he has recorded two albums "Serranillas del Marqués de Santillana" and "Cantigas de Roma" for the Pneuma label.

As an instrumentalist he obtains the professional title of piano and in the discovery of the old music, repertoire of which he deeply falls in love begins his arpístico studies with Juan Ramón Hernández Leyva. The harp is the instrument that accompanies it in all its shows as well as some percussions.

Directed, with the soprano Abigail Horro, his duet of voices and harps "Serpens Cauda" centered on the medieval repertoire.

He combines his interpretative facet with an intense teaching work giving classes of oriental dance and dances of the world, corporal expression, piano, harp, musical language and song.
